# THE FUTURE OF CUFFLEY CAMP OUTDOOR CENTRE – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### Introduction

1. This report supplements the published Cabinet report on the future of the Cuffley Camp Outdoor Centre. Whilst the Resources, Property & the Economy Cabinet Panel focused on the financial and commercial aspects of the recommended decision, this paper also provides additional information on the issues raised at the recent Children's Services Cabinet Panel and in the petition that was presented to the Resources, Property and the Economy Cabinet Panel.

### **Alternative Provision of Outdoor Activity Centres**

2. Both the petition and the Children's Services Cabinet Panel identified concerns about what alternative facilities exist should schools no longer be able to send children to Cuffley camp. There are 31 known activity and residential centres in and around Hertfordshire within a 90 minute drive of Cuffley Camp. Those venues (summarised in Appendix A) have in excess of 6,000 residential places available for young people. In addition to the residential venues listed there are also three providers who cater for day visits. Websites such as UKschooltrips.co.uk and planmyschooltrip.co.uk illustrate the extensive range of providers and types of outdoor education experiences marketed to schools.

#### **Alternative Lease Arrangements**

3. The Council's lease contains significant prohibitions against what is termed 'alienation' and therefore the Council are unable to consider sub-leasing or other partnering arrangements, through which the Council might be able to provide similar services through a different operating model.

#### **Operational Context & Failure to Implement Lease Obligations**

- 4. Cuffley Camp has been run with the objective of operating as a self-financing facility and therefore has not been allocated an ongoing operational budget. Staffing, equipment, resources and property costs are intended to be met through the income it generates from bookings. Unfortunately, the Council has been unable to achieve this goal and the centre has been incurring net costs for the last few years.
- 5. There are a number of possible factors contributing to the site not being financially self-sufficient under Council operation. Overall bookings have declined by 11% since 2011, and 5-day bookings have reduced by over 50%.

- 6. This is a market where competitors, including the Scout Association, have been able to invest significantly in their sites. Whilst the decline in bookings is considered to be related to the lack of investment in the site and an extensive range of competitive offerings, it is also likely to be related to pressures on school budgets and decisions made locally by schools about the extent of extracurriculum activity provided.
- 7. The uncertainty about the future viability of the service, combined with a lack of clarity about formal lease management responsibilities, have combined to create the situation now faced, where considerable maintenance and dilapidation arrears have arisen.
- 8. Service and Estates officers have therefore been in discussions with both the landlord and the Big Lottery Fund to identify the options open to the Council, including the financial impacts set out in the Part II paper.
- 9. Given the ongoing financial pressures affecting all council services, and our experience in the last few years of not being able to run Cuffley Camp as a selfsufficient operation, the Council have now reached the position where a decision about future options is required.

#### **Status of the Lottery Grant**

10. A Big Lottery grant was utilised to fund the construction of a new dining hall and kitchen facility in 2007. Clawback arrangements were included in the agreement should future use of the facility change. The amount required to be repaid to the Lottery Fund should the Council withdraw from the lease is set out in the Part II paper being considered by the Panel.

### **Future Operations**

11. It will be for the landlord to determine what it chooses to do with the site should the Council give up its lease. There is the potential for a specialist provider to work with the landlord to secure an alternative approach for the provision of outdoor education activities at the site. However, the landlord is unlikely to be able to pursue any such opportunities unless the uncertainties created by the outstanding issues relating to the Council's current lease are resolved.
