Report of the CYPICE Task and Finish Group

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1.0 Purpose of report

To agree the Children, Young People and Families Integrated Commissioning Priorities for 2015/16.

2.0 Summary

- 2.1 The attached Integrated Commissioning Priorities have been developed in conjunction with colleagues from E & N and Herts Valley CCG's and Hertfordshire County Council, including Children's Services and Public Health. It is an overarching framework which details our joint principles and priorities for integrated commissioning during 2015/16.
- 2.2 The partnership has agreed that it will develop a shared quality assurance framework and a single, integrated commissioning strategy within each of the three priority areas; Early Childhood, 0-25 Integration for Children and Young People with Additional Needs and the whole system review of CAMHS.
- 2.3 This work will inform the development of a whole-system, best practice model for Hertfordshire and an overarching Integrated Commissioning Strategy to inform future needs, options, decision and strategies for partners responsible for commissioning and delivering children and family services. This will run alongside the development of the new Health and Wellbeing Strategy.
- 2.4 The previous draft of the attached paper has been presented to the East and North Herts Joint Partnership Board and the Executive Team Business Meeting. It has also been presented to the Herts Valley

Children and Young People and Maternity Board and recommended to the Herts Valley Management Executive. During CYPICE on 15th May further feedback was given and this has been taken into account in the attached report.

- 3.2 That the final version of the Integrated Commissioning Priorities 2015/16 is circulated again to stakeholders who have seen a previous draft.
